- "Culture is a deeply ingrained part of the very fiber of our being, but language — the means for communication among members of a culture — is the most visible and available expression of that culture" (Brown, 1994).
- "Culture awareness both enables language proficiency and is the outcome of reflection on language proficiency" (Kramsch, 1993).
