Army CID Special Agents conduct felony criminal investigations, undercover operations, and executive protection. CID special agents can also specialize in financial, national security, and cyber crimes. CID Special Agents receive the latest in law enforcement investigative training and perform professional criminal investigations worldwide, using state-of-the art technology.

Army CID Mission

Army CID conducts felony-level investigations and operations, while providing criminal intelligence to proactively prevent crimes which impact the operational readiness of the Army. CID investigates felony crimes of serious, sensitive, or special interest matters to support and preserve the Army's resources in peacetime, combat, and contingency operations. Army CID also conducts worldwide investigations of classified Army programs and sensitive activities; acquisition and procurement fraud affecting Army programs, systems, major construction and Soldier safety; cyber intrusions, related malicious activities, and insider threats involving U.S. Army networks; and terrorism activities.

- Must not have reached 37 years of age (exceptions may be considered for eligible veterans and those currently covered under the 6C Federal Law Enforcement Retirement System).
- Must be a U.S. citizen.
- · Must have a valid driver's license.
- Adhere to standards of conduct and maintain honesty and integrity.
- Undergo a background investigation, credit checks, and drug testing.
- Must be able to obtain and maintain a Top Secret Sensitive Compartmented Information (SCI) security clearance.
- Pass a medical exam, which includes but is not limited to, meeting visual and hearing standards.
- Complete and graduate from the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center's (FLETC) Criminal Investigation Training Program (CITP) or be a graduate of another certifying academy consistent with agency policy.
- Be prepared for worldwide assignments throughout your career which may require temporary or long-term relocation.
- Work a schedule that may include irregular hours, nights, weekends, 24/7 on-call availability, and a minimum 50 hours per week.
- · Carry a firearm and be willing to use deadly force, if necessary.
- Be willing and able to participate in arrests, execution of search warrants.
- Competitive candidates for the position of Special Agent will have at a minimum a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university.
