



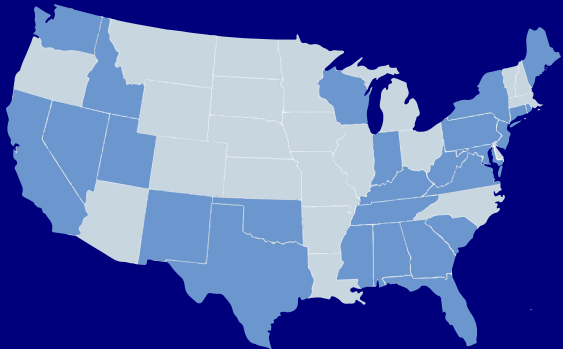

OUR ACTIVITIES

HEADQUARTERS

NAVSEA Headquarters provides policy, oversight, and guidance in all areas of business and acquisitions, including contracts, engineering, corporate operations, logistics, maintenance, industrial operations, and financial and program management.

WARFARE CENTERS

Utilizing their engineering and science expertise, the 10 Warfare Centers provide full-spectrum science and technology, research, development, testing and evaluation, and product delivery support for the Navy's ships and systems.

NAVAL SHIPYARDS

The four public Naval Shipyards provide quality, timely, and cost-effective maintenance, repair, modernization, recycling, and technical and logistics support for all ships of the United States Navy fleet.

SUPERVISORS OF SHIPBUILDING

Co-located with major private shipbuilders, the Supervisors of Shipbuilding serve as the Navy's on-site technical, contractual, and business authority to ensure the highest quality ships are delivered by the private industry to the fleet.

REGIONAL MAINTENANCE CENTERS

The four Regional Maintenance Centers (RMCs) develop and execute standardized maintenance and modernization processes, institute common policies, and standardize training to provide cost-effective readiness to the Navy's fleet. With several international locations, the RMCs keep the fleet charging both at home and abroad.
